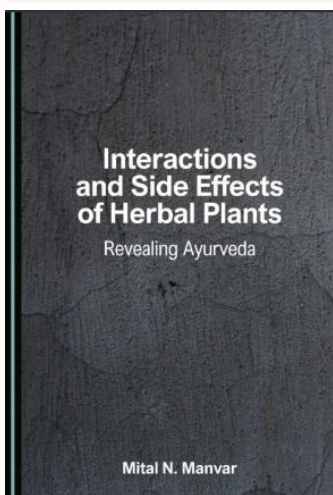

The patent was officially filed on August 29, 2024, and is granted for a term of 20 years, highlighting the sustained commitment to cutting-edge pharmaceutical research and innovation.
